Working with Children Check - Swimming:

IMPORTANT

Child Safe Standards requirements introduced in 2016 make it imperative that any parents or carers **MUST** have a valid Working with Children Check (WWCC) card if they want to support staff on excursions (or taking part in student events, whether at school or offsite) where they interact with any other students.

We very much need parents to support students at the pool during swimming. However, we cannot have any parents present at the pool who do not have a valid Working with Children Check Card.

Parents who are volunteers at the school should read and complete the Code of Conduct and OHS forms which are available in the 'Volunteer Packs' at the office.

Parents who attend the pool during Swimming sessions to help with our students will be asked to present their WWCC card. This is a mandated requirement in all schools. Thank you for your support to keep all our students safe.

ALBANY RISE PRIMARY SCHOOL

HOMWORK POLICY

RATIFIED BY SCHOOL COUNCIL: 21st November 2018

REVIEW DATE: 2021

PURPOSE:

- 1.1 To support and enhance the learning process specific to the child's needs.
- 1.2 To foster and develop sound lifelong learning and study habits.
- 1.3 To encourage parents to take on a supportive role in students' learning activities.
- 1.4 To consolidate classroom learning.
- 1.5 To encourage students to become responsible for their own learning

GUIDELINES:

- 2.1 Homework will be consistent across the level and set according to DET guidelines
- 2.2 Homework will show consideration for the students' age, ability and general needs. Homework may be individualised to meet these needs.
- 2.3 Homework will be assigned to reinforce classwork, not to teach.
- 2.4 Set homework will be based on achievable aims and in easily manageable quantities.
- 2.5 Parental interest and involvement will be encouraged, but the effort and final product will be the student's own work.
- 2.6 The teacher will be the first point of contact should a problem arise with a student's homework and it is the responsibility of the class teacher to check homework on a regular basis and provide feedback to students.
- 2.7 When a student regularly does not complete homework the class teacher will contact the parent(s).
- 2.8 Homework is generally handed out on a weekly basis so that it can be balanced with a range of recreational, family and cultural activities
- 2.9 Homework will consist mainly of:
 - Reading activities to, with and by parents or individually as appropriate
 - Tasks that are a continuation of classroom work, projects, research and unfinished work
