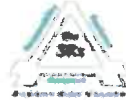

Remembrance Ceremony- RSL Ceremony and 9th November at Albany Rise

I had the privilege of attending the RSL Remembrance Ceremony at the Springvale War Cemetery with school leaders on Sunday, 4th November. Our students represented our school beautifully, and listened to some recollections of historical events from some highly respected guest speakers. Dr Rosalie Triolo, shared a moving series of recollections from school children's experiences of the Armistice in 1918, and the impact

the conflict and the ceasing of hostilities had on school children (and teachers) all over the state at the time.



Tomorrow, we will hold our own ceremony, recollecting the sacrifices many servicemen and civilians made during these hard times, and the fact that 100 years has passed since the signing of the Armistice in 1918. Families are invited and encouraged to attend. The service will be held under the new flagpole area at the front of the school, as part of our whole school assembly. Students bringing wreaths or flowers to create class wreaths, are asked to take them directly to the classrooms to be stored until the ceremony later in the day.

Student Learning & Curriculum: AIP

Each year, every school takes time to develop an Annual Implementation Plan (AIP) which sets the learning and curriculum goals and priorities for the year ahead. During Term 4, Albany Rise school staff and community take time to review the positive outcomes for the current year and look at future opportunities to improve student learning outcomes.

Over the past 2 weeks, our school leadership team have been working to review the 2018 AIP and develop priorities for our 2019 AIP. This annual plan takes into account individual, cohort and whole school learning needs, staff professional learning, resource allocation and Department of Education priorities. In developing our 2019 AIP, school leaders have referred to our 4 year strategic plan, and the input from staff, students and parents during our 2017 whole school review. We have referenced information from our 2018 Parent Opinion Survey data and comments, and have looked at other sources of information, such as Student Attitudes to School survey data, teacher survey data, NAPLAN and teacher judgements of student outcomes.

As a school, we are continually seeking opportunities for families to provide input into our annual plans to improve student outcomes.
